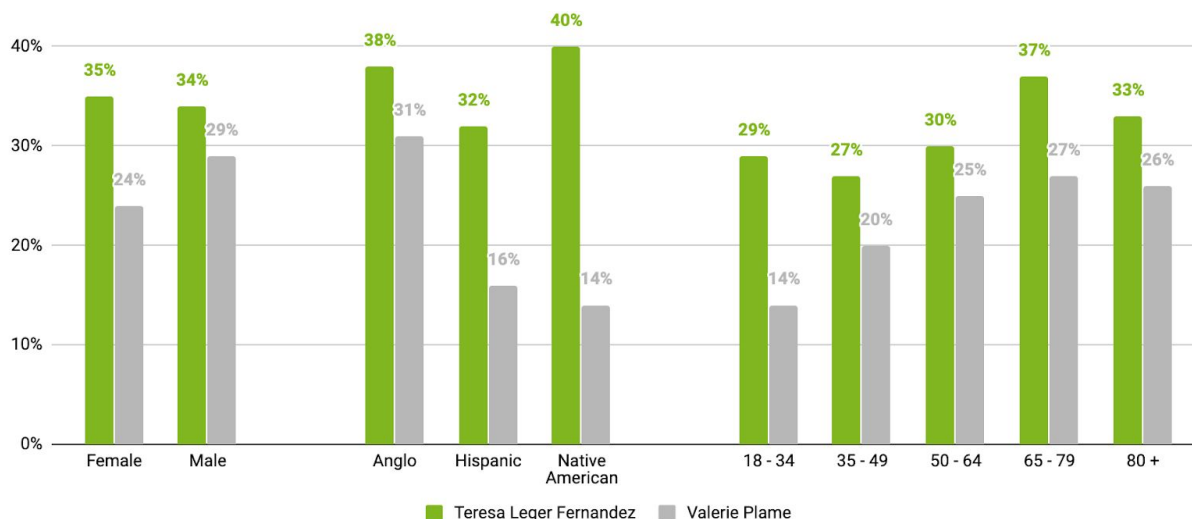

Summary: Teresa Leger Fernandez Leads Two-Way Race For Congress

On behalf of EMILY's List, Clarity Campaign Labs polled likely Democratic primary voters in New Mexico's 3rd Congressional District on May 20th and May 21st, 2020. We surveyed 661 voters by telephone, using IVR calls to landlines and live operators to cell phones. The margin of error is +/- 3.76% at a 95% confidence interval.

Teresa Leger Fernandez has a lead in the race for Congress over Valerie Plame, **33% to 24%**. No other candidate is in double digits - Marco Serna is at 9%, Joseph Sanchez is at 7%, John Blair at 4%, Laura Montoya at 3%, and Kyle Tisdell is at 2%.

Leger Fernandez's support comes from voters across the district. She leads among both women and men, and with every age group. She leads among Anglo voters, but has a wider lead with Hispanic voters and Native American voters.



All respondents were also asked to choose a second-choice candidate. Supporters of Serna, Sanchez, Blair, Montoya, and Tisdell are more than twice as likely to choose Leger Fernandez as their second choice than they are Plame, **28% to 13%**.

Because of the pandemic, we expect record-breaking participation by mail in this primary. Leger Fernandez supporters are extremely motivated to vote - among people who have requested their absentee ballots already, she leads Plame **41% to 28%**.

With less than two weeks until the Primary, it's clear that Teresa Leger Fernandez has a lead outside the margin of error in what's become a two-person race, with opportunities to further grow her lead as voters make their final decisions.
