1). Do you believe there is a concerning rise of antisemitism on the [Right or Left], including in your own party? How do you propose to address this issue?

I don't agree with the Trump plan. The Palestinians were not involved in the plan's drafting and they have to be at the table to ensure a peace plan that can be supported and sustained.

3). Why would you re-enter or stay out of the JCPOA with Iran? If re-enter, under what conditions or changes? How should the United States deal with the Iranian government on an ongoing basis? Should the U.S. military maintain a presence in the Middle East?

I would re-enter the JCPOA with Iran. Iran under the deal had accepted significant limitations on its nuclear program that would prevent them from developing nuclear weapons. President Biden has stated he will re-enter if Iran follows strict compliance. I agree. We should deal directly with Iran and enforce their compliance through sanctions. We should maintain a presence in the Middle East.

4). Should the U.S. increase, maintain or decrease the amount of foreign aid to Israel and other countries in the Middle East? Should the U.S. condition its aid for specific results? What does the U.S. benefit from its relationship with Israel?

We should maintain the amount of foreign aid to Israel and other countries. The funding to Israel should go without conditions. However, the United States should work to move parties in the direction of pursuing a two-state solution and discourage any use
