Dear Mr. Jope:

I write to express my deep disappointment with Ben & Jerry's recent decision to not do business in the West Bank, and therefore end its current relationship with its licensee which manufactures Ben & Jerry's ice cream in Israel and distributes it in the region. I would sincerely hope that Ben & Jerry's, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Unilever, will reconsider this wrong and misguided decision to fuel efforts to single-out and undermine Israel, and will promptly reverse course.

I strongly support a negotiated, two-state solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict resulting in the democratic, Jewish state of Israel living peacefully alongside a viable, democratic Palestinian state. However, I believe that Ben & Jerry's recent decision sends the completely wrong message. As Unilever has acknowledged, the "Israeli-Palestinian conflict is a very complex and sensitive situation," and it will not be solved by businesses like Ben & Jerry's participating in one-sided, political boycotts. This and other efforts including the Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions (BDS) movement do not promote peace; rather, they single out one side of the conflict for blame while encouraging the other side to reject direct negotiations in favor of a unilateral strategy.

While I am glad that Unilever has affirmed it is committed to its presence in Israel, I hope that you understand the harmful consequences of such a misguided, disappointing decision, and reverse course by continuing to do business without yielding to anti-Israel political pressure.
